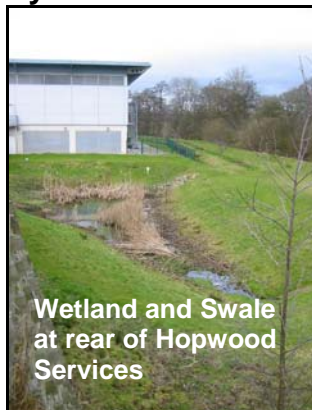

February 18 - Worcestershire



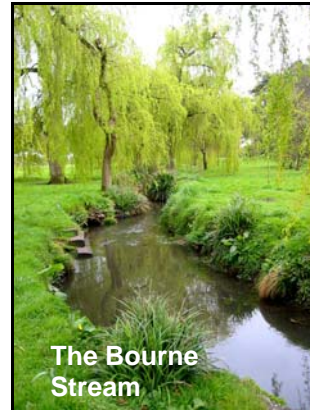
In February Bob Bray (*RJB Associates*) led a field visit to SUDS installed at Hopwood Services and to 2 School sites in Worcestershire.



We even had some rainfall so we could see the SUDS features 'in-action', and they worked!

April 15 - Bourne Stream.
SUDSnet visited the Bourne

Stream in Bournemouth, hosted by the *Bourne Stream Partnership*.



We were treated to a morning of presentations about the Bourne Stream and in the afternoon we visited sites within the catchment.



This catchment proved to be an excellent example of SUDS and river restoration techniques being used together to improve the whole watercourse.
